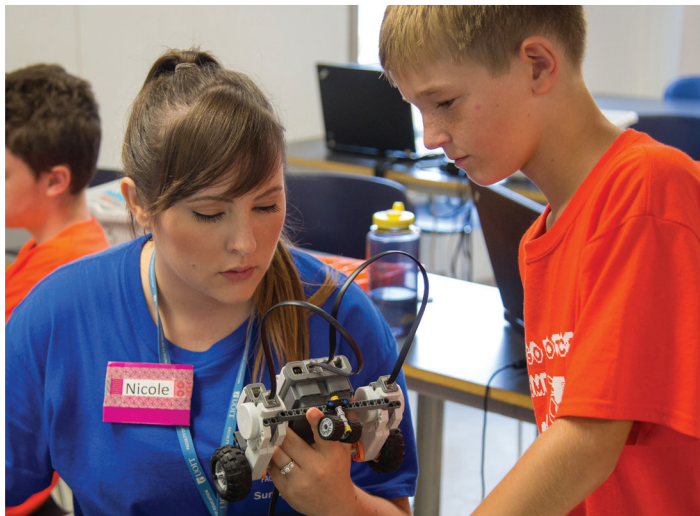

Since 2003, enrolment at the University of Ontario Institute of Technology has increased tenfold.

To meet commitments ranging from academic and student-study space to opportunities for community and business partnerships, the Campus Master Plan outlines development of 190 acres of property for new classrooms, laboratories and infrastructure required to support the learning of future students, professors and researchers.

For Durham Region and Northumberland County, this means more employment opportunities, resources and education options.

Measuring our impact:

- Created and sustained an estimated 3,800 jobs in Ontario since inception.
- Will contribute more than \$1 billion to the economy of Durham Region and Northumberland County between 2016 and 2020.
- Synthesizes an institutional perspective and voice on current and developing public policy matters by hosting an annual Futures Forum relating to the university's academic, sustainability, research and innovation activities.
- Modern research and testing facilities support hundreds of business and industry partnerships with faculty experts.
- Expanding downtown Oshawa's reputation as a cultural venue by hosting community and entertainment events in the renovated historic Regent Theatre.
- Leads Research Talks at the Robert McLaughlin Gallery.
- Visits Durham-area schools through the Let's Talk Science program.
