The Whitby Campus Library hours remain unchanged.

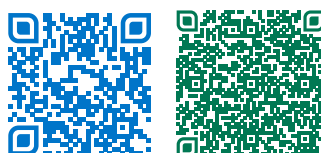

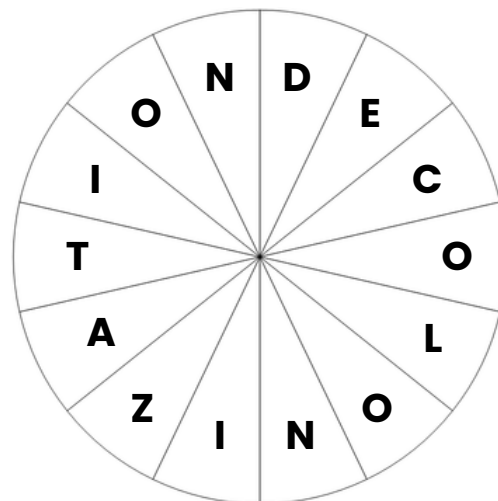

Arrange the numbers below into the grid so that the sum of each row, column, and diagonal are the same.

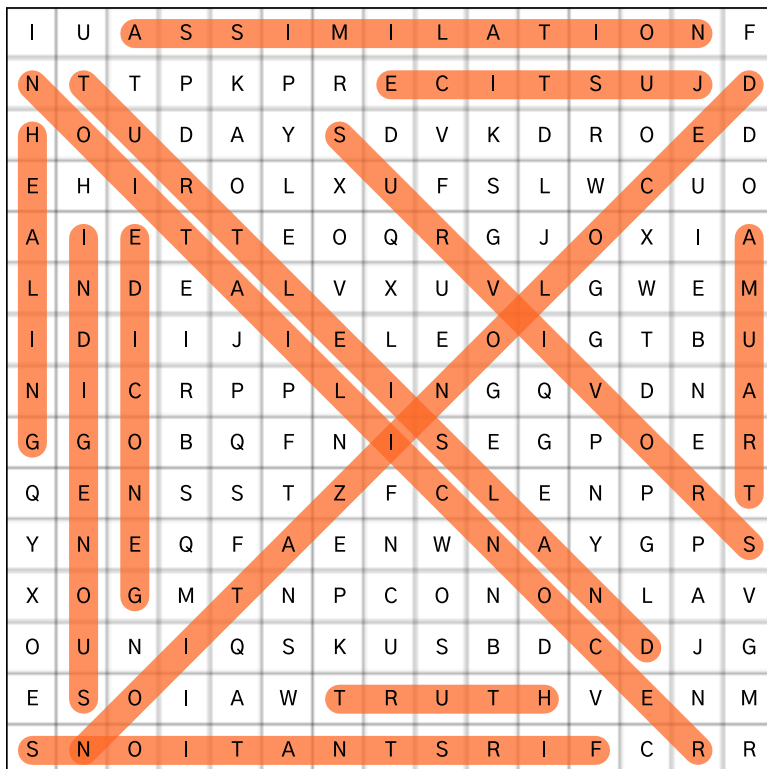
