1. Introductions- Environmental Club Members

2. Minutes Approval

- Minutes from last meeting approved

3. Program Updates (e-waste, personal printer, Smart Commute/Blancride, Gord Miller, City Speaker Series etc.)

- Melissa followed-up on waste collection discrepancies it is now on DC's radar. We will be working with them to ensure that recycling happens properly.
- Melissa is working with DC on E-waste.
- Professor Hamid Akbari from the Faculty of Engineering and Applied Science has created an App called Blancride for carpooling and smart commuting. It works on both Android and Apple software. The pilot phase is just for UOIT and DC. Presented to Durham Region who are considering adopting the APP for their use as well.

- Personal printers UOIT staff and faculty have a total of approximately 145 printers. These printers may remain as is. We are working with IT to streamline the evaluation process that will determine the need for new printers.
- Eighty people showed up to see Gord Miller speak on his annual report. One large class was led to the event. A professor asked if, in future, the event could be videotaped. If so, she would be willing to use it for a mandatory assignment. Murray asked if Gord might be invited back annually to present on his latest report.
- The City of Oshawa is hosting a speaker series event on March 28 for earth hour at the Regent Theatre. The focus will be on carbon and energy reduction. The event will kick off a 30 day carbon challenge leading up to and culminating on earth day.

4. STARS vs GRI

- Melissa presented on two measurement systems GRI vs. STARS.

DC is solely focused on STARS.

Melissa believes that we can submit the same info to both and therefore would like to submit to both for certifications. She is looking to create one report that she can submit for acceptance to both.

Ken thinks we can reach GOLD certification with STARS. At this point, Melissa thinks she (and he work study student) can manage the accompanying workload.

Ken suggests that the committee explore if anyone is willing to take on pieces of this.

5. Plan Update

6. Tree Planting Initiative (Ramez-student)

- An upper year Engineering student wanted to set up a Memorial tree planting for his graduating class with a plaque as a sustainable and visual way to remember their year.

Murray asks that Melissa check with Advancement on this from the fundraising side and that the campus master plan is pretty well set.

Melissa adds that the campus master plan would be a determining factor on where and when this could take place.

One alternative option might be for this student to get a tree and plaque downtown as part of Oshawa's Green plan 2020.

7. DIY Showcase (FBSC)

- Sheila is planning a Make Your Space (DIY) getting children to create science projects at an event on Feb 15. She needs Ken to sign off on her campus event request form.

8. Peter Love - Joint Committee Presentation Invite (Jan 15th 4:00pm)

- Peter Love (York U prof who developed a program around sustainable energy education) will attend the January 15 Joint (UOIT-DC) Sustainability Committee on January 15 at 4p.m.

9. Open Discussion/New Items

Sheila Rhodes teaches an environmental course within Faculty of Ed and has two grants (TD friends of the environment and TD Citizens-Science) that require her to host conferences. One will be on March 7 open to teacher candidates and teachers and invites the committee members to join/support if interested.

At next joint Committee meeting- will be exploring the type of paper to be used in campus printers.

- Environmental Club: President Baker Baha.

Current initiatives include reducing cup waste by distributing free water-bottles (Student Association ones). They are working on a Social Justice Week series of environmental initiatives. They are campaigning for a living/green wall – ideally in UA.

Ken explains that the University has explored living walls in the past and had an issue around allergies.

A couple committee members mention that Queens, U of Windsor, and DC Whitby all have living walls.
