All 2000-level courses now have the prerequisite course of POSC 1000U. All 3000-level courses now have the prerequisite courses of POSC 2000U and/or POSC 2100U; some 3000-level courses have one or two other options as prerequisites. POSC4000U now has the prerequisite: One of: POSC 2000U, POSC 2100U, POSC 2200U.

CALENDAR DESCRIPTION

Political culture is understood as the common values, norms and traditions of a particular country or place. Political culture in terms of “race” and racism refers to the ways those values, norms and traditions can reinforce ideas of “race” and perpetuate racism. This course analyses the political, economic and cultural development of “race” and “racism” in political discourse. The theoretical grounding of “race” and critical race theory will be explored and this will build to a discussion of “race” in a specifically Canadian context. The issues of immigration and multiculturalism, which form much of the Canadian political discourse surrounding race, will be the focus of this discussion but international examples will also be used to provide some perspective.

<p>SSCI 3200 Public Administration</p> <p>This course introduces the student to some of the basic concepts of Canadian public administration and provides an analysis of organizational and policy theories and relates them to public administration in Canada. The administrative workings and the interaction of federal, provincial and municipal agencies are explored. The makeup and purpose of the bureaucracy as well as the political framework within which the bureaucracy works are examined.
