FOR ACTION

1. Faculty of Health Sciences

a. New Degree Program Proposal

The Graduate Studies Committee recommends:

That Academic Council recommend to the Board of Governors the approval of the Doctor of Philosophy in Health Sciences program.

Rationale

The Faculty of Health Sciences has proposed a new doctoral program. The program will produce well-qualified health sciences academics and professional leaders by providing a depth of field specific expertise in their chosen field of Community, Public and Population Health (CPP); Kinesiology (KIN); or Health Informatics (HI). These fields are currently part of the Masters in Health Sciences at UOIT. The proposed Ph.D. builds on the success of the Master's program and the solid record of accomplishment of graduate supervision and student training in each field. It will build on existing partnerships with health care and academic institutions to advance faculty and graduate research and to ensure that trainees are exposed to interdisciplinary perspectives "beyond the classroom" setting.

2. Centre for Institutional Quality Enhancement

a. Cyclical Program Review Final Assessment Summary Reports
