Admission requirements*

Durham College students are admitted to the FNTU program with their grades from their first semester at Durham College with the same standards and requirements as students in the ACTU program. They will need at least a B average in their college courses and at least a C in each of the embedded UOIT bridge courses to remain in the program.

The students in the FNTU program will take the following embedded UOIT courses while completing their Durham College diploma:

First Year - Winter Semester

BUSI 1010U Critical Thinking & Ethics ECON 2020U Macroeconomics

Second Year - Fall Semester

BUSI 2401U Finance I BUSI 1916U Business Math II

Second Year - Winter Semester

BUSI 2402U Finance II

These courses are all already offered in these semesters in the BCom program and will not require any additional course offerings.

The FNTU program will be administered in the same way as the existing embedded programs. We are simply integrating the BCom bridge into another 2-year diploma to increase the attractiveness and accessibility of the program for students in Durham Region.

Application Procedures and Natural Intake

The applicant will apply through an internal application form during their first semester of college study.

Admission Requirements

- (a) Applicant shall be a student of a requisite program with a minimum average of "B" (73-76%) in their first semester of study for admission consideration into the Bachelor of Commerce (Honours) Embedded Bridge program.
- (a) Applicant will be evaluated for admission to the UOIT program, recognizing that admission based on minimum admission requirements is not guaranteed, and that UOIT will give preference to the applicants with the best qualifications.

Credit Transfer Agreement

Students shall complete, in good standing, 15 credit hours (5 courses) of bridge courses specific to the their academic credential concurrently with their college curricula. It is advised that the student discuss their transfer credits with the applicable Faculty. Students shall also satisfactorily complete all matriculation requirements as stated in the UOIT Undergraduate Academic Calendar.

Upon successful completion of required courses and matriculation requirements:

- (a) Students will be entitled to continue into the Bachelor of Commerce (Honours) degree; and
- (b) Will be granted 45 credit hours as transfer credits toward the UOIT program.

The above transfer credits are equivalent to one and one-half years of full-time study, or 15 courses out of a 40 course honours degree, within the Bachelor of Commerce (Honours).

If a student changes into another degree program, all transfer credits detailed in this agreement will not apply. Prior to changing degree program, it is advised that the student discuss their academic program requirements with the applicable academic advisor.

Time Frame

Upon graduation from the prerequisite program, and after meeting the matriculation requirements, students can complete the Bachelor of Commerce (Honours) degree, using the following schedule, assuming full-time studies:
