Toronto District School Board ELP partnership

COMMITTEE MANDATE:

- Under the Policy Framework, Policy Owners must consult with deliberative bodies before presenting draft policy instruments to the approval authority for approval
- Undergraduate Studies Committee (USC) has a mandate of maintaining the academic standards set by Academic Council and to serve as deliberative bodies for academic policy instruments
- The Undergraduate Studies Committee is presenting the Toronto District School Board ELP partnership and recommends approval by Academic Council

MOTION:

That pursuant to the recommendation of the Undergraduate Studies Committee, Academic Council hereby approves the Toronto District School Board English Language Proficiency Partnership.

BACKGROUND/CONTEXT & RATIONALE:

In an effort to continue to grow the undergraduate international student population at Ontario Tech University, the Office of the Registrar is proposing a partnership with the Toronto District School Board (TDSB). This partnership would allow international students attending a number of TDSB Adult Learning Centres to be evaluated for admission to Ontario Tech University undergraduate programs that require a 6.5 IELTS on a competitive basis without the presentation of a standardized English language test (IELTS, TOEFL, DET etc.). To qualify, students must achieve a minimum of 70% in grade 12 English (ENG4U) or a minimum of 65% in both grade 11 (ENG3U) and grade 12 (ENG4U) English.

For programs that require a 7.0 IELTS (Nursing and Education), graduates of one of the aforementioned schools can opt to enrol in Level 6 at Ontario Tech University's English Language Centre (ELC) or submit an IELTS of 7.0 (or equivalent).

These standards are based on a long-standing existing partnership with Columbia International College (CIC) in Hamilton, ON. Given the standardized provincial English curriculum and the successful CIC partnership, the Registrar believes that these requirements are appropriate. A number of Canadian colleges and universities have entered into similar partnerships with the TDSB. The Office of the Registrar is confident that participation in the TDSB's Academic Pathway Program will provide the necessary English preparation for Ontario Tech University applicants.

CONSULTATION:

Deliberative Body: USC September 2021 for recommendation Approval Authority: Academic Council October 2021

The development of this language pathway has been done in consultation with the Office of the Registrar and the Toronto District School Board (TDSB). In June 2021, our Director, Admissions and Recruitment met with the coordinator of the TDSB Adult Education International program; both parties considered a partnership to be mutually beneficial. Specifically, this partnership will help build awareness of Ontario Tech and our program offerings in a key market and will help achieve enrolment goals.

NEXT STEPS:

Pending the approval of Academic Council for approval, this agreement would become effective for the September 2022 intake.

In an effort to continue to grow the undergraduate international student population at Ontario Tech University, the Office of the Registrar is proposing a partnership with the Toronto District School Board (TDSB).

This partnership would allow for international students attending one of the following TDSB Adult Learning Centres to be evaluated for admission to Ontario Tech University undergraduate programs that require a 6.5 IELTS on a competitive basis without the presentation of a standardized English language test (IELTS, TOEFL, DET etc.):

- City Adult Learning Centre (CALC)
 - o 1 Danforth Ave, Toronto, ON
- Yorkdale Adult Learning Centre and Secondary School o 38 Orfus Rd, North York, ON
- Burnhamthorpe Adult Learning Centre o 500 The East Mall, Etobicoke, ON
- Scarborough Centre for Alternative Studies
 - o 720 Midland Ave, Scarborough, ON
- Emery Adult Learning Centre
 - o 3395 Weston Rd, North York, ON

To qualify for this exemption, students must achieve a minimum of 70% in grade 12 English (ENG4U) **or** a minimum of 65% in **both** grade 11 (ENG3U) and grade 12 (ENG4U) English.

For programs that require a 7.0 IELTS (Nursing and Education), graduates of one of the aforementioned schools can opt to enrol in Level 6 at Ontario Tech University's English Language Centre (ELC) or submit an IELTS of 7.0 (or equivalent).

These standards are based on a long-standing existing partnership with Columbia International College (CIC) in Hamilton, ON. Given the standardized provincial English curriculum and the successful CIC partnership, we believe that these requirements are appropriate.

The following Canadian colleges and universities have entered into similar partnerships with the TDSB and do not require presentation of a standardized English language test:

- Wilfrid Laurier University
- University of Prince Edward Island
- Centennial College
- Langara College





Toronto District School Board's Academic Pathway Program is available to adult international students who wish to attend a Canadian college or university but do not meet the English language proficiency.



Quick Facts about the TDSB

- The TDSB is the largest school board in Canada and fourth largest school board in North America.



Highlights

- City Adult Learning Centre (CALC) is a secondary school that offers an academic program for adult students who wish to earn the Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD). An adult student is defined as one who is 21 years of age or older. CALC is an adult day school but subject to the regulations and procedures for Continuing Education.
- Supports available includes: Education and Prior Learning Assessment and Recognition (PLAR), Client Care Coordinator and Nurse Practitioners (from South Riverdale Community Health Centre), School Settlement Workers, and the Immigrant Women's Health Centre.
- English assessment conducted on-site with sample assessments available online, including Math and Science.

Specialized Programs

- Canex Co-Op is a full-time program. It provides Canadian work experience and gives you the chance to explore a career to ensure you're making the right choice for your future. It involves an ESL assessment and an interview with a CanEx teacher in the co-op department. There is an opportunity to get hired by the employer, but this is not guaranteed. This is a voluntary experience. We will help you find a placement or you can choose to find your own.
- Child Care Assistant Certificate Program combines in-school studies and co-operative education in a licensed child care facility. Focus is on child behaviour and development from 0 to 12 years of age, where one will learn the needed skills and strategies for effective and professional care giving.
- Personal Support Worker (PSW) requires an English Assessment if you do not have ENG3C. PSW's are trained as healthcare professionals who will contribute to the quality of life of individuals and families in a variety of health care and home settings. You will learn skills and knowledge as a PSW, while gaining experience in a healthcare environment. It involves an interview with a CALC staff member.
- Guidance Counsellors are available to help plan your educational and career pathways from course selection, post-secondary planning and applications and career explorations.
- ESL Supports.

Highlights

- **Services** include Career & Personal Counselling, Day Care, Information Centre with numerous resources and Salon Services at a nominal charge by hairstyling students.
- **ESL/English** is of central importance & encourages a lifelong love of reading & writing, as well as its focus on the need to use language both skillfully and confidently in work and everyday life.
- Co-Op Education allows a combination of time in school earning credits and time in the workplace setting. Most careers can be accommodated and the most popular are as follows: accounting clerk, teacher's assistant, office assistant, hairstylist, dental assistant, community support worker, web developer and desktop publisher. This is an 18-week program from September to February or February to June. A written English assessment is required, as well as an interview with a co-op teacher.
- **Hairstyling** allows students to earn credits while working in the salon environment, which allows student to practice skills. This is a 10-month program and begins twice a year in September and in February. This includes 5 months at school learning in a fully equipped salon and an optional 5 months working as a co-op student in a private salon. A material cost of \$600.00 is required, as well as attendance in-class from 8:10am to 3:00pm.
