**SUBJECT: Major Program Modification – Bachelor of Commerce Advanced Entry**

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### COMMITTEE MANDATE:

In accordance with the Undergraduate Studies Committee (USC) Terms of Reference, USC has the responsibility “to examine proposals for new undergraduate degree programs and major changes to existing programs and to recommend their approval, as appropriate, to the Academic Council”.

### MOTION FOR CONSIDERATION:

That, pursuant to the recommendation of USC, Academic Council hereby approves the Major Program Modification to the Bachelor of Commerce Advanced Entry program.

### BACKGROUND/CONTEXT & RATIONALE:

The Faculty is proposing to add new language regarding transfer credits and seeking Academic Advising as well as making changes to the program maps to match the changes to the Major programs already approved.

### RESOURCES REQUIRED:

There are no anticipated resource requirements. The Office of the Registrar and C&M will need to update marketing and recruitment materials to reflect this change.

### TRANSITION PLAN:

The original Bachelor of Commerce MPM had the following phrase for implementation timeline: “Current BCom students will continue to follow their current program maps. This change will impact students beginning their first year of Bachelor of Commerce program in Fall 2022.”

These pathways programs are designed to transition college diploma holders to a modified 3rd and 4th year Bachelor of Commerce program map. As a result, the changes for these programs will be implemented at the start of the Fall 2024 semester.

Fall 2024: All approved changes in the Bachelor of Commerce MPM will apply to all incoming pathways students entering the modified 3rd year map.

Co-op:

While pathways students will become eligible for Co-Op starting in Fall 2024, the Dean's office will decide at that time if this option is available to pathways students (considering resources and logistics), and if yes, the sequence of the work-study semesters. Coming into the program in year 3, pathways students should expect to stay at Ontario Tech longer and for additional semesters if they decide to pursue Co-Op (if available).
