

ACADEMIC COUNCIL REPORT

SUBJECT: Major Program Modification – Master of Arts (MA) in Criminology	

COMMITTEE MANDATE:

In accordance with the Graduate Studies Committee (GSC) Terms of Reference, GSC has the responsibility "to examine proposals for new graduate degree and diploma programs, major changes to existing programs and to recommend their approval, as appropriate, to the Academic Council".

MOTION FOR CONSIDERATION:

That, pursuant to the recommendation of the Graduate Studies Committee, Academic Council hereby approves the Major Program Modifications to the Master of Arts in Criminology.

BACKGROUND/CONTEXT & RATIONALE:

The Faculty is proposing to update modes of delivery for courses that are taken in the first semester of the MA program to include either hybrid or online synchronous formats, in addition to in-person.

The intent is not to create a hybrid program. The course schedule will be reviewed annually to ensure a balance between delivery modes, as appropriate.

RESOURCES REQUIRED:

TRANSITION PLAN:

New course modes of delivery will be effective Fall 2023.

There has been ongoing discussion with CRIM MA students who have wanted more flexibility with course delivery and increased options. It was decided to keep the first semester of the program in person or hybrid and then ongoing course offerings could be in-person, hybrid or online synchronous.
