COMMITTEE MANDATE:

In accordance with the Undergraduate Studies Committee (USC) Terms of Reference, USC has the responsibility "to examine proposals for new undergraduate degree programs and major changes to existing programs and to recommend their approval, as appropriate, to the Academic Council".

MOTION FOR CONSIDERATION:

That pursuant to the recommendation of the Undergraduate Studies Committee, Academic Council hereby approves the Major Program Modification to the Bachelor of Arts in Criminology and Justice program to add specializations in Victimology & Victim Studies and Policing in Society.

BACKGROUND/CONTEXT & RATIONALE:

The Faculty is proposing to:

- Add a specialization in Victimology & Victim Studies to the Criminology and Justice program
- Add a specialization in Policing in Society to the Criminology and Justice program
- Add a new course, CRMN 3029U (Crime and the Elderly) to the Criminology major, Criminal Justice specialization, Victimology & Victim Studies specialization and the Policing in Society specialization.

The specialization in Victimology & Victim Studies will add a victim-focused option within the Criminology and Justice program, to enhance understanding of the victim experience as they move through victimizing experience.

The Policing in Society specialization will appeal to students with an interest in policing or law enforcement, which remains one of our core areas of interest among incoming students.

CRMN 3029U will provide a specialized lens pertaining to aging and crime that is currently underrepresented in existing course offerings in the criminology program.
