## Words That Sound Similar: Some Common Examples

Word	Hint
Accept Except	Verb: to receive (I accept your apology.)  Preposition: not including (Everyone is going except me.)
Affect Effect	Verb: to have an influence on (Your sleep habits may affect your grades.) Note: this word is only used as a verb  Noun: a result or consequence (Most medicines have side effects.) Verb: to bring something about (to effect change)
Allowed Aloud	Verb: permitted (Am I allowed to smoke here?)  Adverb: to speak or laugh so that other people can hear
Aural Oral	Adjective: Related to the ability to hear  Adjective: Related to speaking or to the mouth <i>(an oral presentation)</i>
Broach Brooch	Verb: to carefully introduce a topic that may be sensitive  Noun: decorative jewelry worn on clothing
Change Exchange	Verb: to make something different Noun: an alteration or modification (a change of plans)  Verb: to give something and receive something else in return Noun: the process of exchanging (I made an exchange at the store.)
Choose Chose	Present tense of the verb <b>to choose</b> ; stress the /oo/sound  Past tense of the verb <b>to choose</b> ; stress the /o/ sound
Complementary  Complimentary	Adjective: describes when two different things match or go well together  Adjective: free, or the nature of giving compliments
Coarse Course	Adjective: describes a rough texture; rude or offensive material <i>(coarse jokes)</i> Noun: this word has many meanings; for example: <i>a series or program</i>
Council Counsel	Noun: a group of people with a particular responsibility  Verb: to advise

Foreword Forward	Noun: an introduction to the author or the subject, at the beginning of a book  Adjective: relating to the future (forward planning)  Adverb: toward the front (Drive forward into the parking spot.)
Loose Lose	Adjective: meaning 'not tight' (I lost weight and now my clothes are loose.)  Verb: think of 'lost' to help you remember this word (I win: you lose.)
Of Off	Stress the /ov/ sound Stress the /ff/ sound
Passed Past	Verb: the past tense of to pass ( <i>The car passed me at full speed.</i> )  Can be an adjective, noun, adverb, or preposition – but never a verb
Personnel	Adjective: individual or private  Noun: employees or staff
Principal Principle	Noun: the person in charge of an institution, such as a school  Adjective: the most important (the principal reason)  Noun: a belief or value (Truth is a basic principle.)
Quiet Quit Quite	Adjective: to be silent or almost noiseless ( <i>The class was completely quiet.</i> )  Verb: to give up or abandon ( <i>I quit!</i> )  Adverb: can mean either almost ( <i>It's quite impossible.</i> ) or completely ( <i>She was quite lovely.</i> )
Role Roll	Noun: relating to the way someone is involved in an activity (an actor's role in a play)  Multiple meanings, as a verb, noun, adj, prep: refer to a good dictionary
Stationary Stationery	Adjective: not moving <i>(There was a stationary car outside the house.)</i> Noun: paper, envelopes, writing pads, etc. The 'e' in envelope will help you to remember.

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
