Bachelor of Arts (BA) General Requirements

- Students pursuing the LLP Pathways Program will complete a condensed 90 credit hours at Ontario Tech, as outlined below, before entering the accelerated LLB program at Teesside University. Students who successfully complete the first year of the Accelerated LLB program at Teesside will be eligible for a total of 30 credit hours (10 courses) towards completion of the student's Bachelor of Arts (Honours) in Legal Studies from Ontario Tech.

Key Progression Courses

You are strongly encouraged to complete courses in the order they are listed in this program map. Failure to do so can lead to delays in progression and graduation. Key progression courses for this program include: LGLS 1000U, LGLS 2200U, LGLS 2940U

Program Requirements

To be eligible for the Bachelor of Arts (Honours) Legal Studies - Teesside LLB pathway, students must achieve and maintain a minimum 3.0 cumulative grade point average (CPGA) with no individual course grade below a "B-".

Upon completion of this **five-year pathway**, graduates attain a BA (Honours) in Legal Studies from Ontario Tech University and an LLB from Teesside University. Graduates will have the option of pursuing professional legal qualifications in Canada or in the UK. Interested students should check with the National Committee on Accreditation (NCA) of the Federation of Law Societies of Canada for what additional requirements to expect if they want to return to Canada to practice law.

Students who do not complete the Accelerated LLB program at Teesside may return to complete the remaining 30 credit hours to obtain their 4 year honours BA in Legal Studies.

This program map assists you in tracking your degree progression and is designed as a guide to help with course selection and planning. Your Academic Advisor can assist you with reviewing and interpreting your degree requirements. We encourage you to meet with your Advisor at least once during your studies to ensure you are on track to complete your program as expected.
