Bachelor of Arts BA (Honours) Requirements

To graduate with your BA Honours from the Faculty of Education (FED) the following criteria must be met:

- Successfully complete 120 credit hours
- Achieve a minimum 2.0 cumulative GPA
- Complete all specialization courses as outlined for your specialization (as per the <u>academic calendar</u> and program map below)
- Complete 39 credit hours (13 courses) EDST elective courses.
- Complete a minimum 12 credit hours (4 EDST elective courses) at the 4000 level
- Complete a minimum 18 credit hours (6 EDST elective courses) at the 3000 and 4000 level
- Complete at least 36 credit hours (12 courses) at the 3000 or 4000 level
- Complete no more than 42 credit hours (14 courses) at the 1000-level
- Complete at least 9 credit hours (3 courses) outside of FED EDST courses, which are not at the 1000 level.

Key Progression Courses: We strongly encourage students to complete courses in the order/year they are listed where possible. Failure to do so may lead to unexpected delays in the completion of your degree requirements due to prerequisites. Key progression courses for your program include: Year 1: EDST 1000U Foundations of Learning, EDST 1100U Problem & Inquiry Based Learning

Year 2: EDST 2110U Assessment and Evaluation, EDST 2140U Creating Digital Tools, EDST 2150U Teaching to Facilitate Learning, EDST 2500U Foundations of Equity, Diversity, and Inclusion

Elective Definitions:

EDST Elective: All EDST courses that are not core courses offered by the Faculty of Education are eligible as Educational Studies electives. Please plan accordingly for pre-requisite course requirements.

Elective Definition: Any course offered at any undergraduate year level from any faculty, where there is not a program, credit or prerequisite restriction.

Program Opportunities:

The Educational Studies program offer a great deal of choice and opportunity to choose your own academic path based on your individual interests and goals. It is recommended that educational studies students consider minor options to help focus and guide their degree progression if they need teachable subject areas for a B.Ed. program.
