

HONORARY DEGREE RECIPIENT

Ms. Christina Sorbara | Doctor of Laws, honoris causa



For her renowned leadership in the real estate development industry, community volunteerism, philanthropic endeavours that have contributed greatly to the growth of Durham Region and beyond,

and her success as a national team athlete, the university proudly confers upon Ms. Christina Sorbara the honorary degree of Doctor of Laws.

Ms. Sorbara is a highly regarded business executive, strategic coach, author, speaker and athlete. Within the family-owned real estate development company, the Sorbara Group of Companies (Sorbara Group), she serves as Vice-President of Corporate Knowledge, part of the Strategic Planning Oversight Group, and as Head of Human Resources and Corporate Responsibility for the entire group of companies.

Ms. Sorbara and the Sorbara team currently oversee numerous projects in various stages of development in and around the Greater Golden Horseshoe, including past and present builds in Durham Region.

She is also a Director of the Advisory Board, Chair of the Human Resources Committee and the Chair of The Sam Sorbara Charitable Foundation (celebrating 40 years); the main vehicle for the family's and company's community engagement and philanthropy. Ms. Sorbara holds a Bachelor of Arts in Business Economics and International Relations from Brown University in Rhode Island. She is also a trained strategic coach through Adler International Learning and the Ontario Institute for Studies in Education at the University of Toronto.

Among her other pursuits, she sits on the SickKids Foundation Board, its Campaign Cabinet, and the SickKids Innovator Advisory Council; she is a Director of the Board with Bannockburn Montessori School, Co-chairs its Facilities Committee, and is past Director of the Board with The Toronto Santa Claus Parade.

She is an active volunteer for Brown University with the university's Annual Fund Class Committee, its Sports Foundation Women's Hockey Committee, and its Admissions Alumni Interviewing Program. She is former captain of the Brown Women's Ice Hockey Team, and member of the Brown Women's Rugby Team. She is the former captain of Canada's National Women's Inline Hockey Team and has competed in eight world championships.

She regularly speaks on various topics including: women in leadership, leadership, philanthropy, family business dynamics and real estate development.

HONORARY DEGREE RECIPIENT

Mr. Edward Sorbara | Doctor of Laws, honoris causa



For his outstanding accomplishments in business, his commitment to building a culture of philanthropy and a lifetime of charitable and volunteer service, attributes that align with Ontario Tech's

key values of integrity, inclusion, intellectual resilience and innovation, the university proudly confers upon Mr. Edward Sorbara the honorary degree of Doctor of Laws.

The son of a first-generation Canadian, Mr. Sorbara has been Principal of the Sorbara Group of Companies (Sorbara Group) for nearly 56 years. The Sorbara Group has been an innovative force shaping Ontario's real estate sector for more than 80 years; an integrated real estate, planning, development, construction, investment and management firm, operating commercial, industrial, office and retail properties, managing residential rentals and building high-rise and low-rise communities. Mr. Sorbara is involved in all phases of the real estate industry, including residential, industrial and commercial land development, industrial construction, and residential construction and property management.

Mr. Sorbara joined the family business in 1967 after completing a bachelor's degree in Commerce at the University of Toronto and a master's degree in Business Administration at the University of Chicago.

Learning the values of hard work and philanthropy from his parents, his business acumen is guided by two principles: his company 'should care about quality because the family's name goes on everything', and with whatever they build, they should 'make sure it works'. Mr. Sorbara has always led by example. To encourage a spirit of philanthropy in his children, he and his wife Marisa brought them to volunteer with Meals on Wheels, SickKids and Villa Colombo Homes for the Aged, and to attend various charity events.

He has received many accolades, including the Queen Elizabeth II Diamond Jubilee Medal in 2012, honouring his significant contributions and achievements in the community and Canada. As a member of one of 20 Italian-Canadian families who supported the creation of Galleria Italia at the

Art Gallery of Ontario, in 2015 he was appointed a Commander of the Order of the Star of Italy. In 2016, he also received a Real Estate Excellence Lifetime Achievement Award from the Greater Toronto Chapter of the National Association for Industrial and Office Parks for his outstanding leadership, achievements and contributions. In 2018, he received The Senate 150th Anniversary Medal for his generosity, dedication and volunteerism.

He is well-regarded in the building and landdevelopment industry, and by business associations across the country. - President of the Urban Development Institute of Ontario and of Canada.
- Member of the founding Steering Committee of the Toronto City Summit Alliance, where he Co-Chaired the Affordable Housing Coalition.
- Long-standing member of the Society of Industrial and Office Realtors and the National Association of Industrial and Office Parks.

Mr. Sorbara continues to play an active role in supporting communities. He is a former United Way of Greater Toronto board member and currently sits on the Archdiocese of Toronto Finance Council and related Catholic Cemeteries' Board. He is also Treasurer of the Board of the Villa Charities Foundation, and founder of their annual Giro Cycling Fundraiser. Additional leadership roles include membership in the Literary Circle of the Toronto Public Library Foundation, and founding the Vaughan Breakfast for Prostate Cancer Canada.

THE UNIVERSITY COAT OF ARMS



The Coat of Arms was granted to the university on July 15, 2009 by Claire Boudreau, Chief Herald of Canada under the authority of the Governor General of Canada. The Coat of Arms offers a graphic representation of important facets of the university, as well as its history, values and achievements.

It highlights the university's ties to the regional, national and worldwide communities from which the university draws its mission and purpose. The university reserves the use of the Coat of Arms for commemorative and ceremonial purposes.

The Coat of Arms consists of a shield, a crest, supporters and a motto. The shield, at the centre of the arms, contains three elements: an open book, a canoe and a division line.

The open book denotes an institute of higher education. The inverted canoe alludes to intellectual exploration and signifies the university's location in Oshawa, which means portage or carrying place. The division line represents energy, innovation and community.

Atop the crest a falcon perches with its head facing forward to see the world as it is and to find ways to make a difference. The falcon, a symbol of leadership and persistence, holds a thunderbolt with flames at the top and bottom. Lightning bolts crossed behind the falcon emphasize the importance of technology. Thoroughbred horses flank the shield to reference Windfields Farm, which was located directly north of the university, and famed for breeding champion racehorses. As an official symbol of Canada, the horses also represent excellence, energy and agility. They stand on a mound of grass set with trillium flowers





THE UNIVERSITY MACE

The mace symbolizes the authority, independence and responsibility of the university as a protector, creator and facilitator of knowledge. It is carried before the President and Vice-Chancellor, and the Chancellor in the Academic Procession and rests on its stand throughout the ceremony.

The mace was unveiled at Convocation in 2007. Designed and crafted by Beth Alber, Associate Dean, Faculty of Design at OCAD University in Toronto, Ontario, it consists of a strong handle of carved cherry wood, an elegant and hardy tree native to southern Ontario. Rings of polished quartz and sodalite, in the university's colours, top the wood. The handle supports a crown of silver in the form of an abstracted flower bud, which is intended to be a reminder of our unending responsibility to nurture, protect and celebrate academic achievement among students, faculty and staff. The surfaces of the petals are etched with the microscopic imprint of a poplar leaf, as a symbol of hope and endurance. The mace is supported by a base of Belmont Rose granite from a quarry in the Kawartha Lakes region, representing the foundation of knowledge and our interdependence with the surrounding community.

GONFALONS

The gonfalon, a flag that hangs from a crosspiece or frame, originated in the medieval republics of Italy as an ensign of state or office. Universities from around the world have adopted gonfalons and they use them during Convocation ceremonies to symbolize the different academic areas within the university. The eight gonfalons displayed at the university's Convocation ceremonies represent the university and its seven faculties. Gonfalon carriers march at the head of their faculty during the procession, followed by the students who will graduate from each of the faculties during the ceremony.





ACADEMIC REGALIA

The colourful academic dress worn in the Convocation ceremony was introduced more than 600 years ago. At the university, all graduates wear a gown, with a cap and hood. The gowns of bachelor's and master's graduates are black. The gowns of doctoral graduates are dark blue and trimmed in light blue. Mortarboards are worn by bachelor's and master's graduates, and velvet bonnets are worn by doctoral graduates. The hoods of bachelor's and master's graduates are black and the hoods of the doctoral graduates are dark blue. All degree hoods have an inside lining of royal blue as the colour of the university. The colour of the velvet trim on the hoods is distinctive of the degree that has been earned by the graduate. Graduate diploma recipients wear a black bachelor's gown.

The Chancellor and President and Vice-Chancellor wear gowns that are distinctive of the positions they hold in the university community. University governors who participate in the Convocation ceremony wear a gown and sash distinctive of the Board of Governors. University officers, faculty and staff who participate in the Convocation ceremony wear the academic dress distinctive of the institution from which they graduated and the degree they received. If the institution's colours are not available, participants will wear a black gown.
